
## Configuring Zotero Settings for the Zotero Web Library in Chrome (no download required)


1. Go to **Zotero** and install the chrome connector.




2. Add to Chrome.




## 3. Add extension.




4. After installation, click the puzzle piece icon. When the dropdown menu appears, select the pin next to "Zotero Connector," which will add the Zotero shortcut to your menu bar.




5. Right click on the Zotero plug-in icon (please note that if you are on a page where citations are available, such as the library's website, the "Z" icon will be replaced with the image of a yellow folder) and then select "Options."




6. On the options page, click the "Authorize" button to "Save to Zotero.org."




7. A new browser will open to authorize the application. On the "New Private Key" page, "Accept Defaults."




8. Right click on the Zotero plug-in icon (the "Z" or yellow folder icon) and select "Options."




9. When back on the Zotero option page, under the "Save to Zotero.org" header, make sure the button now reads "Reauthorize." Close tab.



10. Next, navigate to the <u>TMC Library</u> homepage and search for a topic of interest. Once you have found a set of results you would like to save, click on the Zotero plug-in icon. If this is the first time using this extension, you will receive a dialogue box that asks "Is Zotero Running?" If so, "Enable Saving to Online Library."



11. The "Zotero Item Selector" window will appear. Check the box next to any item you would like to add to your library, then click "OK."



12. Zotero will save your selection. You can then open your Zotero web library and refresh the page. Your results will be saved to your library.
